If each of the seven gifts were represented in a family and someone just dropped the dessert on the floor, here is what each one might say...

<u>Prophet</u> - ... That's what happens when you're not careful!

Motivation: To correct his life.

<u>Service</u> - ...Oh, let me help you clean it up.

Motivation: To fulfill a need.

<u>Teaching</u> - ... The reason that fell is that it was too heavy on one side.

Motivation: To discover why it happened.

Exhortation - ... Next time let's serve the dessert with the meal.

Motivation: To correct the future.

Giving - ...I'll be happy to buy a new dessert.

Motivation: To give to a tangible need.

Administration - ...Jim, would you get the mop? Sue, please help pick it up; and Mary, help me prepare some other dessert.

Motivation: Achieve the immediate goal of the group.

Mercy - ...Don't feel badly; It could have happened to anyone.

Motivation: To relieve embarrassment.

## **INTERRELATIONAL ACTIVITIES OF MOTIVATIONAL GIFTS**

## **Church Project - To Build A New Building**

Assignment is given to a committee of seven people, each one having one of the motivational gifts. How will it work?

<u>Prophet</u> - Is this the right thing to do? Is this God's perfect will for our fellowship?

<u>Service</u> - What can I do to get this project accomplished and the building built?

<u>Teaching</u> - What does God's Word say about building a place for His worship?

<u>Exhortation</u> - How can we encourage everyone to get involved and be used effectively by God?

<u>Giving</u> - How much should I give in order to see this building built? How can we encourage others to learn the joy of giving?

<u>Administration</u> - As far as I can see, these are the basic steps we need to take to build it.

<u>Mercy</u> - We need to make sure we do not get so busy building that we forget people.

## The <u>ministry</u> gift of teaching accomplished by the various motivational gifts:

<u>Prophet</u> - Will usually use the lecture mode and focus on the class as a whole.

Will usually have strong convictions and "soap boxes" from which to preach. Tend to be more evangelistic and burdened for lost people.

<u>Service</u> - Personally involved with particular needs of class members. Seek to involve their class in service opportunities. Recognize special dates in the lives of class members.

<u>Teaching</u> - Many details and much information given to the class. Seldom get off the subject and deal directly with the text. May not be motivated by particular needs or practical applications. <u>Exhortation</u> - Interested in spiritual needs and struggles of members. Class will be practical with advice about how to handle given situations. Christian life issues more than evangelism.

<u>Giving</u> - Will usually sponsor class projects and parties and pay bills. Seek to motivate others to learn the joy of giving. Not usually the strongest Bible teacher.

<u>Administration</u> - Organize the class to get work done effectively. Look to the long-term effectiveness of the class. Prefer to see the total ministry of the class rather than just Bible study.

<u>Mercy</u> - Strong desire to listen to members, pray with them, and cry with them.

Appeal to others who are sensitive in spirit; usually do not meet the needs of those less sensitive.

Application of lesson to remove the hurts of members.

## If seven people representing each of the motivational gifts met to organize an ideal church, here is what each one would probably emphasize.

What we need in our church is . . .

<u>Prophet</u> - ...preaching which exposes sin, proclaims rightousness and holy living, and warning of judgment to come.

<u>Service</u> - ...practical assistance to each member of the church to encourage him and to help him fulfill his responsibilities.

 $\underline{\text{Teaching}} \text{-} ... \text{in-depth Bible studies and strong doctrinal messages}.$ 

<u>Exhortation</u> - ...personal counseling and encouragement for each member to assist him in applying scriptural principles to his daily living.

<u>Giving</u> - ...generous programs of financial assistance to missionaries and other ministries.

<u>Administration</u> - ...smooth-running organization throughout the church so that every phase will be carried out decently and in order.

<u>Mercy</u> - ...special outreach and concern for the precise and varying feeling of individuals with a readiness to meet their needs.
