 - (6) Instead of making him a martyr, Domitian exiled John to a little rocky island about 24 miles off the coast of Asia Minor.
 - (7) Domitian believed that John, at his age, would die of exposure or would break.

 - (2) Domitian dies in 96 A.D. and his successor, Nerva, let John return to Ephesus where eventually he would die. (Domitian faced his judgement before the old man of Patmos died.)
